

Transportation Assistance—Ideas and Suggestions:

We want you to be able to access your health care and personal needs! Ask for help but be kind, gracious, grateful—even write a Thank You note to people that help you.

Here are ideas concerning transportation assistance:

Ask family, a friend or someone from your church to take you/pick you up. Offer to pay for gas. Be aware of how much it takes and be kind, fair and gracious to them. If you make an appointment at one of HCC Network Clinics and keep it, they may be able to provide transportation to and from your appointment. Don't ask every church for help—ask your church.

Ask an agency you utilize for services to take you/pick you up. Be kind and fair. Some have policies to not transport constituents so be understanding

Call and ask a local Senior Center. Many Senior Centers provide transportation assistance to low-income, disabled and others in need of rides. Call at least 24 hours prior to the time you need a ride. They can often take you a 10-mile radius of their Center. It is .50 cents to a \$1.50 for each on and off. Be kind and grateful—they don't HAVE to do this. **Lexington 4-Life Senior Center** is at 811 D. South Hwy 13. Please call 660-259-9019. www.lexington4life.org

Medicaid. Call the number on the back of your Medicaid card to arrange a ride in advance. They generally need a 3 day notice BUT if your doctor calls about your need, they can often arrange a ride faster. **MTM--Medicaid patients call 1-866-269-5927.** www.mtm-inc.net/missouri/

OATS. Don't feel bad about calling OATS and ask if there is ANY other way for you to get a ride. Often, there are options you don't know about. These are nice people—be kind and grateful as you always may need them in the future, too. The Midwest Region OATS phone number is 1-800-276-6287, www.oatstransit.org/bus-schedules.
